



Graduate Certificate in Urban Design

The AUDRC offers a graduate certificate in urban design which provides a ‘top-up’ qualification to practitioners and graduates of related fields



The Graduate Certificate in Urban Design provides students with a preliminary overview of the discipline of urban design and an introduction to its core principles, theories and practices. Students graduating with the Certificate would be familiar with the basic characteristics of urban design but would not be understood by the market as ‘urban designers’. The Certificate course aims to provide a ‘top-up’ qualification to professional practitioners and graduates of related fields. The Graduate Certificate in Urban Design typically is comprised of these three units:

- Forces that shape Cities (URBD 5807). In this unit students examine key factors that have shaped urban form throughout history including the economics, politics, culture and the arts.
- Case Studies in Urban Design (URBD 5808). This unit is concerned with the implementation of complex urban design projects.

- Urban Design Workshop (URBD 5804). This unit introduces the key principles of urban design in a studio environment.

Students can choose to enter at either semester 1 or semester 2 but must seek advice prior to enrolling from the AUDRC on structuring their studies. Entry into this course requires an undergraduate degree in a related field with a weighted average of at least 60%, or as recognised by the Faculty on the recommendation of the AUDRC’s Academic Committee. Australian and International students (already from 37 countries) are welcome to apply.
